



have done in the past.


Literacy: Week 1 and 2- The Colour Monster. We watched videos of the Colour Monster making a mess in a different area of the classroom each day. We then made rules of how to tidy each area to learn about our classroom expectations. We also discovered that we all have a superpower and drew pictures of ourselves as a superhero and labelled them. This was linked to Super Millie and the Super School Day.

Maths: In Maths this half term we have covered lots of different concepts including; numerals to 10-writing these and matching numeral to quantity, exploring the length of objects and ordering them according to size whilst using non-standard measures, using objects and a number line to find one more and one less than, comparing quantities to 10 and recognising when quantities are greater than, less than or the same and 2D and 3D shapes.



This half term, we have been looking at Goldilocks and the three bears! The outcomes have been beautiful and we have put all of the skills learnt to write our own narrative of Goldilocks and the Three Bears.



Maths:

WOW! The maths coverage this term has been phenominal! We have shown fantastic skills in our number and place value unit, looked at addition and subtraction and even challenged ourselves with learning to tell the time! Well done class 2, Miss Bartlett and Miss Pearson are extremely proud with how quickly you picked the time concept up- it can be tricky at times!

Wider Curriculum:

Victorians has been our focus subject driver this half term. We have learnt so much about what life was like as a Victorian. We have enjoyed making rules in computing, exploring different religions in RE and learnt lots about germs in PD.

We are looking forward to welcoming Mrs Brusby back into class after the October half term. Mrs Brusby is a very experienced teacher who has worked for HCAT for a number of years. She was also Miss Redfearn's teaching partner in Y2 at another school and we are very excited to have her now join us at Hoylandswaine.

Literacy:

In Literacy we have looked at the text Edward Tulane and we have written a retell based on what we have read. We have focused on skills such as use of dialogue to move the narrative forward, cohesive devices and descriptive language.

We have read a range of fiction and non-fiction texts in our reading sessions, and we have focused on answering comprehension questions using full sentences and quoting from the text.

Maths:

In maths we have covered place value, the four operations, measure and statistics. We have created our own sets of data using tally charts and then displayed this using a bar chart. We are continuing to work on our times tables knowledge and record our scores from TTRS each week. We use the Let's Go, Solve It and Apply It tasks in maths to challenge ourselves in our learning.


Wider Curriculum:




Wider Curriculum:

the holocaust.






There are plans for a residential for all Y5 and Y6 on 17th -19th June 2024. This has now been booked and the deposit paid.
